

## **English - part 6 (37)**

Annotation: The subject aims to introduce students to the key factors in cargo operations, ensuring the safety of the ship and crew. The issues of packaging, marking, handling, stowage and securing of cargo are discussed. Information is introduced about the most important cargo documents which are used in relation to loading and discharging the cargo. An emphasis is put on the use by students of the IMO Standard Marine Communication Phrases related to cargo and cargo handling. The subject aims to introduce specific terminology and to develop skills for reading comprehension of texts in cargo work and develop skills in oral communication using IMO SMCP. Dialogues are made simulating communication between ship and shore personnel in relation to ship loading / unloading operations. The subject introduces the work on making up a sea protest with the task to develop students' practical writing skills. The syllabus complies with the recommendations of the IMO Model Course 3.17 Maritime English.
